The Campton Hills Police Department is implementing additional health and safety precautions to help protect our residents and employees from the spread of COVID-19. We encourage everyone to follow the protocols and recommendations set forth by the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health.

The Campton Hills Police Department would like to **STRONGLY EMPHASIZE**, that we remain ready to respond to any call for service or situation that may develop within the Village.

The following police protocol will go into effect today on **Tuesday, March 17th at 4:00 PM** and will remain in effect until further notice: Citizens who need to file a police report or receive information should contact the (9-1-1- Non-emergency) at 630-232-8400, or the Police Department at 630-584-0330. Dispatchers will take calls and notify officers appropriately. **As always if you have an emergency, please call 911.**

High Priority/Emergency Calls

- Campton Hills Police will continue to respond to high priority/emergency calls including, but not limited to:
 - o Violent crimes or crimes against persons
 - o Motor vehicle crashes involving injuries or lane blockage
 - o A battery or domestic related incident either in progress or where the suspect or offender is still on scene
 - o Burglaries where evidentiary items need to be collected or the crime scene needs to be processed
 - o Or where the shift supervisor or Officer in Charge deems it necessary for a police officer to respond

Low Priority Calls for Service

- Low priority calls involving non-emergencies, delayed calls for service, informational property crimes, or ordinance violations will be handled **via a phone-in-report process**. A police officer will call you back and generate a police report over the telephone after you call into our dispatch center for the non-emergency at 630-232-8400.
- Emergency response personnel will be utilizing social distancing (typically trying to remain six (6) feet away from any other person). So please don't be upset if a member of the Police Department will not shake your hand or stands a distance away from you during an encounter.
- Emergency responders may don some Personal Protective Equipment (face mask, gloves, goggles, etc.) if they go into an environment where an illness may be present or is unknown.

The Campton Hills Police Department will continue to patrol our streets and respond to all calls. We appreciate your understanding that the community's safety, health and welfare are our top priority. Be assured, Campton Hills first responders are taking many precautions with our own health and safety to ensure we may effectively address public safety needs.

Again, we want to assure all residents and visitors to the Village of Campton Hills that we will continue to serve our residents, business owners and visitors as we always have, we are just following the State's and County's guidelines, taking all necessary protective measures to protect the Village as a whole.

If changes in the situation do occur, we will send out notices to any changes in operations, protocols, or responses as soon as possible.

Thank you all for remaining calm, looking out for and working with your neighbors (especially the elderly), and utilizing best sanitary practices, to get through this together.
