

**MINUTES  
VILLAGE OF CAMPTON HILLS  
PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE  
December 3, 2008**

**The fourth meeting of the public Works Committee of the Village of Campton Hills was called to order by Chairman Newkirk at 7:36 p.m. on Wednesday December 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2008** at the Campton Township Community Center, 5N082 Old LaFox Road in the Village of Campton Hills, Kane County, Illinois.

A motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting was made by Member Huske and the motion was seconded. Chairman Newkirk then presented the agenda for the meeting.

A REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS was made. No public comments were received.

OLD BUSINESS:

TRAILS TASK FORCE SUBCOMMITTEE – Recording Secretary Reese indicated that the Trails Task Force Sub-Committee (TTFSC) would further research some sort of permanent path from Castle Road to the Forest Preserve connecting to the Great Western Bike Trail

Chairman Newkirk requested further research by the TTFSC into a possibility of creating a 4-foot bike lane along Campton Hills Road from Peck Road to La Fox Road. Newkirk also volunteered to communicate with South Elgin, Elgin and Lilly Lake about their bike trails and possible extensions into Campton Hills near the Corron Road open lands areas.

Newkirk provided Reese with a contact for an intern that may be able to help with mapping and creating proposals for the TTFSC.

Ex Officio Millette said that a funding source called the Great Lakes Mega Region Bike Path Funding Source (or something similar) was available for trail development. More information is needed.

Member Boveri offered to contact local bike clubs to gather input in locating non-official trail connections in the area.

Member Huske suggested that the route from the Great Western trail to the Fox River bike trail has some dangerous areas that bring the path in close contact with automobile traffic and asked the TTFSC to further research.

The TTFSC agreed to research an access point requested by Member Lambe from the Great Western Trails to the Village of Wasco for snow mobiler's.

Member Reese stated that he had received updated maps from the KaneGIS. The maps were provided to member Ulreich to load for review at the up-coming TTFSC meeting.

Village Zoning Official Ranieri announced that the Evening Prairie Subdivision flood control program is as far as Nancy Lane with drain tiles.

## NEW BUSINESS

Member Huske told the committee that he had picked up about 30 illegal roadsides "bandit" signs in the previous week. He requested that the public should contact him at 630-842-3229 for removal of any illegal or nuisance signs.

An announcement was made that the Norton Lakes Development was hosting and open house on December 16<sup>th</sup> 2008 to gather input for their concept plans.

Member Ulreich suggested that a flashing stop sign or a "Cross traffic does not stop" warning sign be posted at Old LaFox Road near the post office and Rt. 64 due to recent accidents.

The lack of a gasoline service station in the Village was brought up. Member Schulte offered that he has experience in that area and would be available for further discussion regarding future plans regarding that.

The Public Works committee asked for volunteers to gather accident data for sub-divisions in the Village.

Recording Secretary Reese announced that the TTFSC would hold it's first meeting on December 10, 2008. Reese would provide an agenda to be posted for the public. Member Ulreich agreed to host the meeting at his home office as he had suitable monitor and computer equipment available.

Chairman Newkirk scheduled the date and time for the next Public Works Committee meeting was scheduled for January 7, 2008 at the community center.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS the meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.
