

**MINUTES  
VILLAGE OF CAMPTON HILLS  
PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE  
January 7, 2009**

**The fifth meeting of the public Works Committee of the Village of Campton Hills was called to order by Chairman Newkirk at 7:35 p.m. on Wednesday January 7, 2009** at the Campton Township Community Center, 5N082 Old LaFox Road in the Village of Campton Hills, Kane County, Illinois.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted by voice approval with no Nays voiced.

Chairman Newkirk then presented the agenda for the meeting.

A REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS was made. No public comments were received.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

TRAILS TASK FORCE SUBCOMMITTEE – The Trails Task Force Sub-Committee Chair Reese recounted the minutes of the 1<sup>st</sup> Trails Task Force Sub-Committee (TTFSC) to the assembled Public Works Committee and the results of that meeting were discussed. Reese indicated that he had met with Jim Newman about an internship project to map possible trailheads, new trails and connecting trails within the village in preparation to form project proposals. Newman was in attendance and joined in discussions of the various attributes and hurdles of the proposed routes.

The various assignments of the TTFSC members were re-iterated.

Ulreich – Incorporating Norton lakes trails into the existing Fox Mill path system.

Lambe – Explore trails heads at: Brown Road and Anderson Park and at The Community Center,

Schulte – Explore snow machine corrals at the Country Gas property location and in the parking lot area behind the commercial strip center in Wasco.

Millette – Gather more information regarding the Great Lakes Region Bike Trails Funding Project.

In addition, at a prior months meeting Boveri volunteered to interface with local bike clubs to get their input on designated bike routes.

McDONALD ROAD RESURFACING PROJECT - Ex Officio Millette advised the committee that the McDonald Road Resurfacing Project preliminary engineering report had been completed. He indicated that the project was on schedule and that the committee will be seeking contracts in March.

EVENING PRAIRIE – Newkirk indicated that the Evening Prairie water diversion project is complete and appears to be functioning. Only restoration of trenched areas remains to be completed.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

TRUCK PERMITTING - Millette opened a discussion regarding implementing a truck permit requirement within the Village to assist with traffic flow via designated truck routes. Weigh restrictions, safety and road surface preservation are among the many considerations.

FEDERAL AWPA FUNDS - Millette communicated that he is lobbying to prevent Federal Public Works funds available to the Village from being distributed by the State, and rather through more local channels like through the Congressional offices. He also communicated that the Village will be ready to take advantage of a Motor Fuel Tax distribution when it is ready.

STATE FUNDS – A High Risk Rural Roads Grant is being researched. Jim Newman is working with Chief Anderson to identify high-risk rural roads within the village.

OTHER - Entry signs for Village Roads were discussed. Newkirk volunteered to follow up with the Eagle Scouts to see if they would like to be involved in implementing them as a community project.

Chairman Newkirk scheduled the date and time for the next Public Works Committee meeting was scheduled for February 4, 2009 at the Community Center.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS a motion was made by Huske to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.
