COMMENDATION

Date of Occurrence: January 21, 2012

Location of Occurrence: Milano's Restaurant

Officers Steve Mathis and Margie Lill's actions on January 21, 2012 merit a Departmental Commendation.

On that date, Officer Mathis and Lill were dispatched to a 911 call at Milano's restaurant for a restaurant patron who was unresponsive. Officer Mathis and Lill responded immediately and were on the scene within two minutes. Arriving before the paramedics, Officer Lill observed the patron lying on the restaurant floor being administered CPR. While Officer Mathis retrieved the AED from the squad car Officer Lill proceeded on with CPR after receiving no vital signs. With the patron still not responsive from the CPR, Officer Mathis initiated the use of the AED. Immediately after deploying the AED, Officer Lill continued administering CPR until the paramedics arrived. Upon arrival of the paramedics, Officer Mathis and Lill assisted them with AED deployment, with Officer Mathis continuing CPR until the patron's vitals return. The patron was subsequently transported to the hospital for further treatment.

In speaking with the owner of Milano's restaurant, I was advised that the patron was his son's father-in-law and that he will be released from the hospital shortly less than a week after the incident occurred and is expected to make a full recovery.
